TIKHVIN

Unable to take Leningrad on the march, the Germans wanted to make a deep bypass of the city, planning to meet up with the Finnish troops attacking from the north, while moving east of lake Ladoga. This maneuver, if successful, would doom Leningrad and the hundreds of thousands of soldiers defending the city. The Soviets tried to slow down German attack by sending more and more forces and reorganizing their troops. The newly established Volkhov Front was reinforced with new forces, but the Germans still kept an initiative in their hands. Their XXXIX Corps crossed the Volkhov River and attacked towards Tikhvin. Day after day, the Soviet forces were pushed east and north, but the losses suffered by the Germans made the attack slower and slower. The capture of Tikhvin was the last part of this offensive. The German troops had to defend their very stretched wings, which were already being endangered by the approaching Soviet units.






